With only 5 20 year olds in the line-up experience is a key factor and the Dogs are expecting the older troops to lead by example. The learning curve will be steep but as changes are made in the lineup improvements are to be expected.

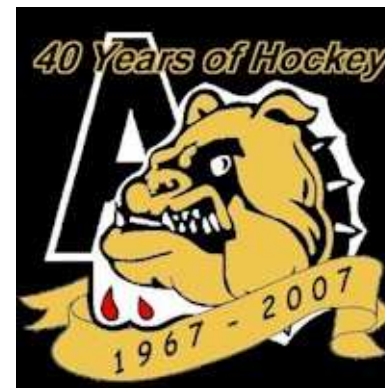

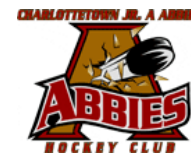
